YOU KNOW WHAT YOU KNOW

Habitat for Humanity ReStores VS Thrift Stores

Both are retail establishments that sell used or donated goods, but there are some key differences between them:

Mission and Purpose:

Habitat for Humanity ReStore: ReStores are specifically operated by a local Habitat for Humanity, which are nonprofit organizations dedicated to supporting families in need of decent affordable housing. The primary purpose of a ReStores is to raise funds to support Habitat's housing programs. ReStore sales directly contribute to building strength, stability and self reliance through shelter.

Thrift Store: Thrift stores are typically run by various organizations, including for-profit and non-profit entities. Their primary goal is to resell donated or secondhand items to the public. The profits generated from thrift store sales may support various causes or organizations, but their primary mission is not necessarily focused on housing or community development.

Merchandise:

Habitat for Humanity ReStore: ReStores primarily sell building materials, home improvement items, and furniture. This includes items like doors, windows, appliances, plumbing fixtures, lumber, and construction materials. While they also carry home decor and furniture, the emphasis is on materials and products related to home construction and renovation.

Thrift Store: Thrift stores typically sell a wide range of used items, including clothing, electronics, books, toys, and more. The inventory can vary greatly depending on donations and the thrift store's specific focus.

Customer Base:

Habitat for Humanity ReStore: ReStores primarily attract customers who are interested in home improvement and construction projects. Homeowners, contractors, and DIY enthusiasts often visit ReStores to find affordable building materials and supplies for their projects.

Thrift Store: Thrift stores cater to a customer base that primarily includes individuals looking for affordable clothing and various household items. Their customer base is generally not interested in home improvement or construction needs.

Impact:

Habitat for Humanity ReStore: ReStores have a direct impact on housing and community development, as the funds they generate contribute to the construction and renovation of homes for families in need.

Thrift Store: While thrift stores may support charitable causes through their profits, funds generated from sales benefit various causes.

Tiny House Build 2024





Habitat for Humanity has been partnering with West Bend and Kewaskum High Schools since 2020 for our Tiny House Build. It's a unique program that allows high school students to learn construction skills and apply them to a project that benefits the community.
